

# ASSEMBLE YOUR

Your wedding suite can include more than just the invitation and reply card. Here, we show

**INVITATION** Standard invitations are about six by eight inches in size, though many shapes and sizes are available. The size and the weight will determine the postage required, so bring a full suite to your post office to get the correct amount.

**RECEPTION CARD** This piece is recommended if your ceremony and reception are taking place in different locations. It should include the address of the reception site and, if it will not immediately follow the ceremony, the time.

**ITINERARY** This can include the times and locations for everything from the welcome party to the send-off brunch. Printed on a single card, it's easy for guests to refer to at a glance.

**TRAVEL NOTES** Use this to give guests information such as local airport codes; airlines that fly there; public transportation; and good options for shuttles, car services or car rentals.

**ACCOMMODATIONS** On this piece, list your suggestions for the best hotel options. Be sure to include each hotel's phone number or Web site, as well as any special rates you've arranged.

**DIRECTIONS** This card is where you can highlight the locations of all the wedding events and places of interest like shops, restaurants and pharmacies; it's very helpful for out-of-towners.

**INSTRUCTIONS** If your venue has any specific rules that guests should be aware of, like regulations for appropriate dress or photography, include them on a special-instructions card.

**AT-HOME CARD** This is a great way to let guests know where you'll be living after the wedding, and what your married name will be (whether or not you plan to change your name). If you don't yet know your new address, you can always send this card later.
